



The Packing

Baggage Information

Carry on dimensions:


21.5 x 15.5 x 9 inches

Carry on: any containers of liquids, gels, shampoos, creams, paste MUST be 3.4 oz. (100ml) or LESS. All such items must fit in ONE clear, resealable quart size bag.

Checked Bags:

must be 50 pounds or less. You will incur an extra fee for bags over 50 lbs.

So let's talk about a few things...





- Students are responsible to carry their own luggage
- •There is fee at the check-in desk for any bag or item that is over the maximum free allowance limit of 50 lbs (23kg). You will be responsible for the fee.
- •You will receive luggage tags that must be attached to the outside of your luggage. You should also have identification outside as well as inside your luggage!
- Souvenirs bought in Austria must be packed in your luggage on the return flight so be sure to leave some room!

Carry-On Baggage



- You may bring ONE piece of carry-on luggage it must meet airline regulations (think backpack!). Ladies may also bring a purse.
- Students with a carry on instrument may also bring a small bag.
- Carry-on luggage must fit under the seat or in the overhead compartment.
- Carry-on luggage will be checked before boarding the buses.
- Please remember the liquid rule: 3.4 oz. or less for each item, & they all must fit in 1 (ONE) quart size bag!
- Please do not send your child with homemade snacks.
 They are not permitted in the airport.

A Few Things to Pack: Money

You MUST change dollars to euros (€), prior to departure. Your bank should be able to help you.

We've learned that it is a hassle to exchange money while in Europe. Please do this in the U.S. ahead of time!

- **ATM Cards** w/ Visa or Mastercard logo should work in European ATM's.
- Credit Cards: alert your company!
- **Euros** current rate is \$1= €.93



A Few Things to Pack: Money

It is recommended that students have some Euros (€), as there is the occasional little shop or souvenir stand that may only take cash.



A Few Things to Pack: Money

 There are 2 lunches on your own. €20 per lunch should be sufficient for each lunch. Also students may want to purchase snacks at the airports.

 Make sure you alert your bank and/or credit card company ahead of time that there will be international charges.



A Few Things to Pack: Other

- Comfortable shoes/clothes
- Jacket/YOCJ Hoodie just in case temperatures drop at night
- Cell phone & charger
- Adapter/Converter for electronics
- Alarm clock
- Rain coat/small umbrella

A Word of Caution

- If you "love it," don't bring it!!!
- We are not responsible for lost watches, jewelry, cameras, etc.





What do I need to wear?

Concert Readiness?



- All Students must show their concert attire to chaperones at luggage check. This includes:
- Black pants or LONG black skirt
- 1 Black top
- 1 White top
- Black shoes, black socks or black stockings
- NO sneakers or sandals for concerts
- Also bring a music stand in your checked luggage



....and in general?



- Dress Code: dress to represent YOCJ and our country in a respectable manner
- Tour T-shirt: on travel days (departure and return)
- No garment bags, please
- Use upscale school dress policy
 - Bring something nice for the Opera!
 - Pants should fit properly on the waist
 - Nothing too revealing

The Instruments and Music

Music and Instruments

Carry on? Yes, if

...your musical instrument is generally smaller than a guitar it must be carried onto the plane. Small instruments to be carried on the plane are: piccolo, flute, oboe, bassoon, clarinet, soprano saxophone, alto saxophone, tenor saxophone, trumpet, violin, viola.

Carry on? No, if

- ...your musical instrument is generally larger than a guitar it must be carried as checked baggage. Large instruments to be checked as luggage are trombones, euphoniums.
- Instruments YOCJ will rent in Germany: Cellos, Double-basses, Tuba, Baritone Saxophone, all Percussion, and Harp

Music and Instruments

- Sheet Music, Stands and Bows
 - * Remember to pack your YOCJ music folder and music stand.
 - * These too, will be checked by chaperones!
 - * Grease and valve oil need to be packed in checked luggage. Lids must be tight. Please pack these containers in a sealed zip-lock bag!

Health Matters

 Please notify the nurse if your child becomes sick or has an injury the week before the trip.

Health Matters

- •State mandates that students may carry epipens, inhalers and insulin.
- Students may NOT carry any other medications — NO prescription or over the counter medications. The nurse will carry and dispense all medication.
- The nurse is authorized to carry Advil and Tylenol while travelling on overnight trips.

Health Matters

- All medication must have a physician's medical order and be brought to the nurse at a designated <u>June 21 final</u> rehearsal...more details to follow.
- Medication both prescription and over the counter must be in the original container with the student's name.

Dietary Issues & Restrictions

- Everyone should have notified us of all and any food allergies, dietary restrictions such as being a vegetarian, etc. with registration.
- Please double check our current list TODAY!
- Please do keep in mind, that if you request a vegetarian diet, the meals might have very little variety (pasta, salad, etc.) since the Austrian dishes are often meat-oriented. Thank you for your flexibilty!

Emergencies at Night for Students

- If you have a nighttime emergency, <u>first</u> contact the chaperone in charge of your room. Lists will be emailed soon.
- You will be informed of the nurse's room location in Vienna & Hallein for sickness type emergencies.
- There are chaperone rooms throughout the hotels. Students will be aware of these once we've arrived in each city.

Austria is 6 hours ahead...



Be Smart!

- Remember, we are in a foreign land. Be aware of your surroundings and personal space.
- Watch out for beggars and/or pickpockets. Use purses that rest in **front**, instead of behind you. Keep wallets & cell phones in **front** pockets, instead of back pockets.
- Always be with at least one other person. Stay in groups.
 Never travel alone! You must check in with your chaperone at their designated times and locations and follow their instructions!
- Be careful who you talk to and don't give out any personal information.

A Quick Review...
